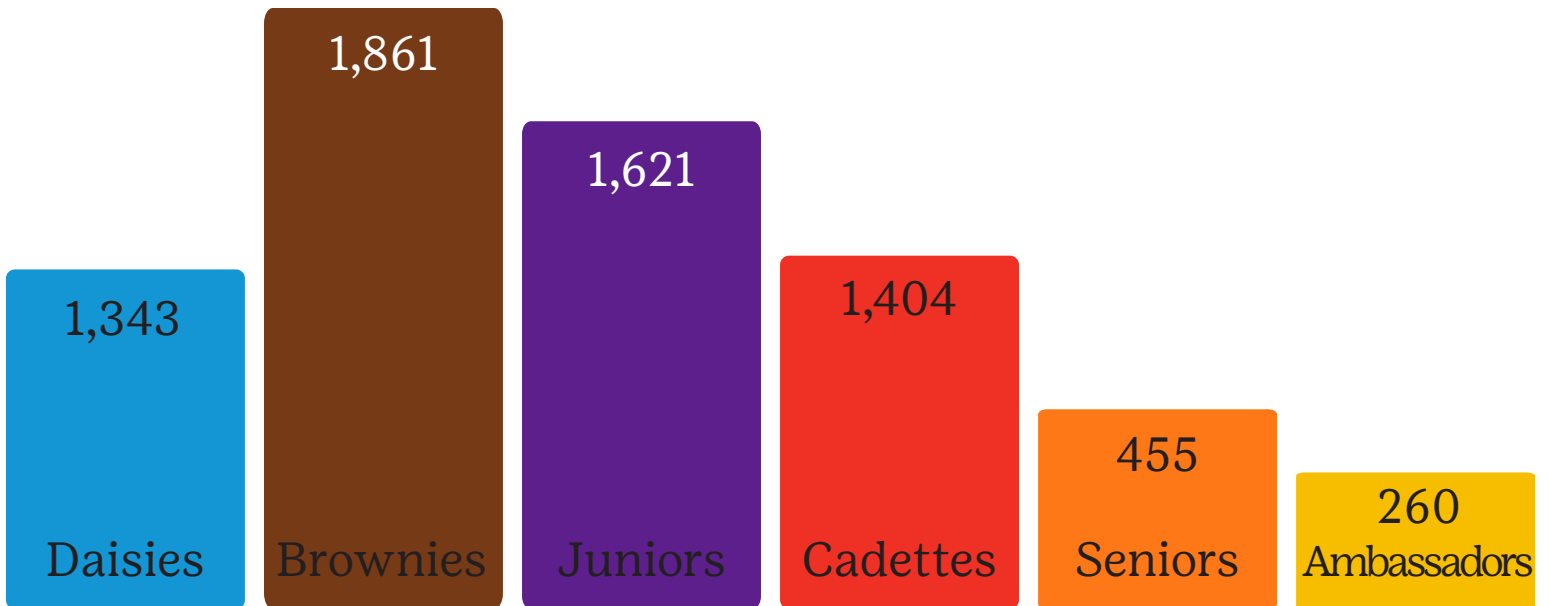

Badge in a Bag

GSHG began offering Badge in a Bag in February of 2020 as a way to help troop leaders, families, and girls earn more badges at home, beyond the formal troop meeting. Each month, badges were chosen from themes that reflect Girl Scouts' four pillars: STEM, outdoor, life skills, and entrepreneurship. The package includes activity materials, instructions, and the badge itself. Badge in a Bag continues to be a success allowing girls to earn exciting badges and offer assistance to leaders.

It's a win-win. As cookie entrepreneurs, girls learn essential life skills like: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills and business ethics. 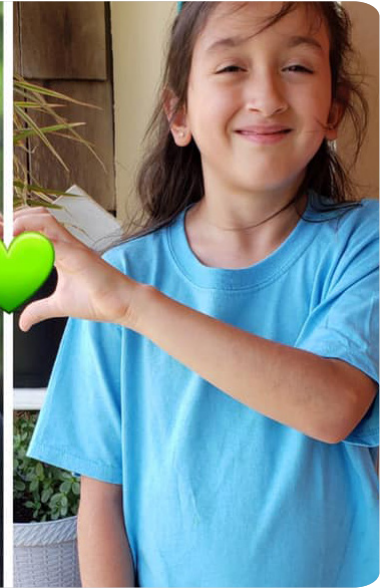

Girl Scouting's highest awards—the Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards—are a Girl Scout's chance to make a lasting difference in their community and the world. Congratulations to all of the 2021 highest award recipients.



Gold Awards earned

Gold Award

The Girl Scout Gold Award represents the highest achievement in Girl Scouting, open only to Seniors and Ambassadors. This prestigious award challenges girls to make a sustainable impact on their communities by solving community problems. Gold Award Girl Scouts are required to provide 80 hours of community service and are eligible for select scholarships as a result of earning the Gold Award. The awards program provides these young ladies with the opportunity to be an inspiration to other girls and serve as incredible examples of what it means to be a Girl Scout.



Silver Awards earned

Silver Award

The Girl Scout Silver Award is the highest award that can be earned by a Girl Scout Cadette in grades 6-8. By earning this award, girls not only strengthen their skills and abilities, they learn about their community and take action to make the world a better place! This community-based project is a minimum of 50 hours. Congratulations to these go-getters!



Bronze Awards earned

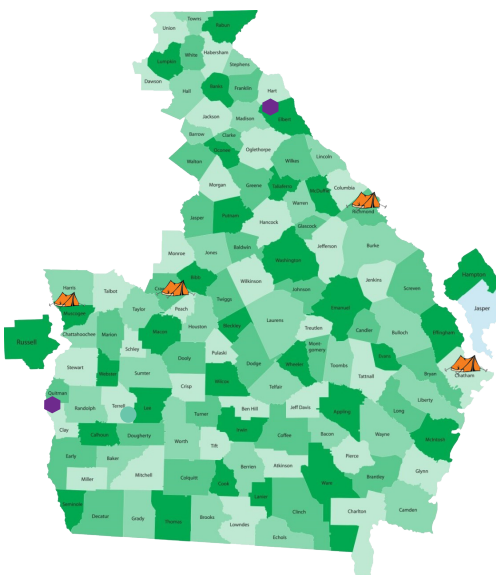
Bronze Award

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest award that can be earned by a Girl Scout Junior in grades 4-5. Earning this award shows that they have made a promise to help others, improve their community and become the best they can be. This community-based project is a minimum of 20 hours.

Special Projects



Historic Georgia was chosen for two national grants related to the new Girl Scouts Math in Nature badges, made possible by a generous grant from Johnson & Johnson. Daisy, Brownie, and Junior troops from the Historic Georgia council were selected to test the content before the release of the badges, plus attend a council-wide event with female engineers from Johnson & Johnson.

24 troops of Daisies/Brownies and/or Juniors earned a total of 328 badges through the grants!

Through these badges girls get outdoors to explore and conserve the natural world as they learn math concepts. Badge activities include discovering shapes and patterns in natural objects, learning about symmetry and tessellation, and mastering time and measurement theories. Girl Scouts then use this background to design nectar feeders, trail maps, and other outdoor tools and essentials.

Math and Nature Badges are available for each grade level, and there are three per grade level.

- Shapes in Nature
- Numbers in Nature
- Design with Nature

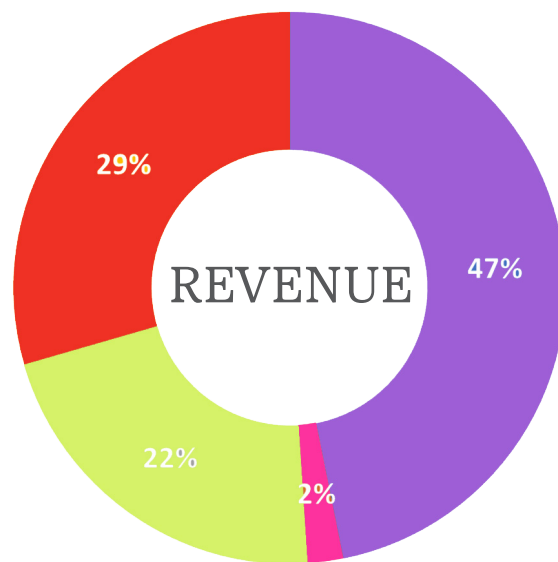
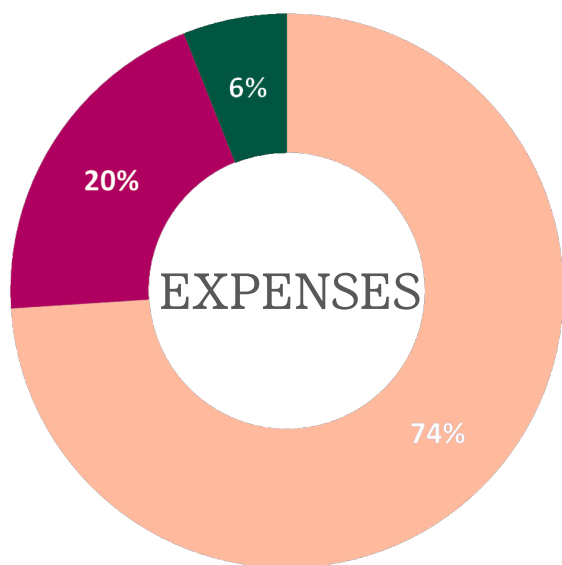
