Explore Juliette Low's hometown to learn about her life, Girl Scout history, and some of Savannah's favorite things.

Brownies: Complete one activity (a - c/d) from each numbered section

Juniors: Complete one activity (a - d) from sections 1 and 2, and complete any three activities in section 3

Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors: Complete two activities (a - d) from section 1, one activity (a -d) from section 2, and any 6 activities from section 3

Troop leaders and program vendors, please use your discretion and knowledge of your audience to adjust these requirements as appropriate to best fit the needs of your girls.

- 1) Walk in Juliette's Footsteps: Visit a place that was important to Juliette Gordon Low and learn about her time there.
 - a. The Juliette Gordon Low Birthplace
 - b. The Girl Scout First Headquarters
 - c. The Andrew Low House
 - d. OR visit Juliette's gravesite at Laurel Grove Cemetery
- 2) Discover the City Juliette Loved So Much: Learn more about Savannah history by taking a tour or visiting a museum.
 - a. Take a tour with our friends at Old Town Trolley
 - b. Take a tour with our friends at Old Savannah Tours
 - c. Explore the Coastal Heritage Society's "Savannah History Museum"
 - d. Explore the Savannah School System's historic & child-focused "Massie Heritage Center"

- 3) Sample some of the wonderful things beautiful Savannah had & still has to offer by exploring, sampling, or getting up-close.
- a. Landmark Places: Within Savannah's Landmark Historic District, there are some truly iconic places. Visit one ...
 - Forsyth Park – the Fountain, Sensory Garden, & / or Farmer's Market are great places to explore.
 - River Street – sample a praline, welcome passing ships with the Waving Girl, & / or be inspired at the Olympic Cauldron
 - Colonial Park Cemetery – visit a Declaration signer, pay respects to Yellow Fever victims, & / or read a wall.
 - The Squares – there are SO many to choose from! Explore at least four: For whom or what are they named? Is there a monument and, if so, who does it honor? Any other neat features you can see?
 - b. Historic Houses of Worship: Take a quiet moment to learn & reflect at one of our Historic Houses of Worship, such as ...
 - Christ Church – the “Mother Church” of Georgia, founded in 1733, this was also Juliette Low's church.
 - Mickve Israel – Established in 1735, Congregation Mickve Israel is the nation's third oldest synagogue.
 - First African Baptist Church – First organized in 1773, FABC is one of the oldest black churches in the nation.
 - Cathedral Basilica of St. John the Baptist – Completed in 1876, this beautiful church is open to the public most days.
 - c. A Taste of Savannah: Sample some of Savannah's historically famous food, sweet treats, and / or foods with a mission to educate or improve, from places such as ...
 - Sweets Treats – Byrd Cookie Company, Leopold's Ice Cream, River Street Sweets, Savannah Candy Kitchen
 - Famous Food – Crab Shack (on Tybee Island), Mrs. Wilkes' Dining Room, The Pirates' House
 - Food on a Mission: Capital Bee Company, Forsyth Farmers Market, Savannah Bee Company
