

Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia Council Update

It's that time of year again, the one everyone waits for with taste bud anticipation! Girl Scout Cookie season is here! There are several options to get your cookie craving met this year. You can order from a girl, find a booth, or order through DoorDash in many areas.

Looking for a booth to support girls in person? Download the Girl Scout Cookie Finder app on iPhone or Android devices, or visit www.gshg.org to use the Cookie Finder. Girl Scouts and DoorDash have partnered this year to make it even easier for people to get their Girl Scout Cookies. Who doesn't think it's great to have a Girl Scout cookie craving and be able to have cookies delivered to your home or office? Cookies can be ordered on the DoorDash website or download the DoorDash app for your iOS or Android mobile device and order from there. DoorDash will be delivering cookies in Augusta, Macon, and Savannah. Get your Samoas, Tagalongs, and Trefoils before they're gone on March 6!

Work continues on an AmeriCorps Planning Grant to develop a major, three-year membership growth program. The goal is to establish or increase our presence in 16 rural counties grouped in six clusters, mostly in the northern and southern parts of the state. Our primary goal is to reach girls facing economic or cultural barriers. The Planning Grant activities will form the basis of an AmeriCorps Program Grant, which we will apply for in February. If successful, that grant will fund the program for the next three years. Girl Scout staff, supported by AmeriCorps members, will establish 36 new troops (about one per month over the three years) with 432 girls by the end of the grant period. The research and foundation for the program has been developed with the help of long-time GSHG alums Myra Blackmon and Paula Maddox.

A note from our CEO:

What is the first thing that comes to mind when someone says Girl Scouts? Many people in the community, including some Girl Scouts from previous generations, view it as an organization where girls sell cookies, do crafts, go camping and make s'mores around the campfire. That's all true, but there are so many other great components! One of the challenges Girl Scouts faces is getting people to view the value of Girl Scouts as a leadership development program for girls. Through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, girls make friends, challenge themselves with new experiences, write their own stories, and develop the skills and confidence to say, "I know I can do this!"

Would you help us spread the word about what the Girl Scout Leadership Experience is all about? The Girl Scout Leadership Experience allows girls to lead and "learn by doing" in a cooperative learning environment. As a Girl Scout, girls find out who they are, what they care about, and how to best use their unique talents; girls collaborate with others, both locally and globally, to learn and expand their horizons. They do what Girl Scouts always do: make the world a better place.



Math in Nature

GSHG was chosen for two grants related to the new Math in Nature badges. One grant was to pilot the content before the release of the badges and the second grant was an activation grant once the badges were finished. Twenty four troops of Daisies/Brownies and/or Juniors earned a total of 328 badges through the grants - what an accomplishment!

The troops did all the badges on their own, except for the Design with Nature badge which we did as a virtual event in October with female volunteers from Johnson and Johnson, who underwrote the entire Math in Nature badge development for GSUSA. Overall, the feedback from girls and volunteers was overwhelmingly positive. We are excited to continue to provide fun and educational badge workshops for all girls in each region!
