A Note from Our CEO

The following letter was shared in 5 on Friday, our weekly newsletter, on December 20, 2024.

We are a resilient and forward-thinking council, and I am excited to see how we will continue to evolve, innovate, and find new ways to empower girls. In the coming months, our Board of Directors will lead the search for a new CEO who will carry forward our mission with passion and purpose. I have full confidence that the next CEO will build on the strong foundation we've created and inspire even greater achievements for our Girl Scout community in the years ahead.

As I prepare for the next chapter in my life, I want you to know that I'll always be an advocate for the Girl Scout Movement. To each of you—Girl Scouts, alum, volunteers, staff, and supporters—thank you for enriching my life and allowing me to serve alongside you. Leading Girl Scouts of Historic Georgia has truly been one of the greatest privileges of my life, and I look forward to seeing all the wonderful ways Girl Scouts will continue to thrive in the years ahead.

GSHG Council Update

The new Girl Scout membership year started on October 1, and, as usual, we are busy!

Our Product Program team is celebrating another incredible Fall Product Program. This year, 1,265 Girl Scouts sold 33,404 items (nuts, candies, and more) to raise funds to benefit their troops. Our top seller was Daisy Girl Scout Braylee F. from Troop 12045, with 240 items. Way to go, Girl Scouts!

Now the Product Program team is gearing up for cookie season, which runs from January 2 to March 9, 2025. S'mores cookies will be retiring after this season, so make sure you stock up while they're still available. Get with your local Girl Scout to preorder cookies, or be on the lookout for cookie booths in your area starting February 14.

Our membership team had a successful recruitment season during Operation: Go Get Her this fall, and they're still working to reach new families, start new troops, and support our existing troops.

Thanks to an initiative through GSUSA, new Daisy troops have access to a complimentary <u>Girl Scout</u> <u>Experience Box</u>, which is a monthly supply box filled with step-by-step instructions, ready-to-gosupplies and thoughtful script suggestions. On October 3, we celebrated the grand opening of Girl Scout DreamLab in Albany. It is the first in the nation to be located inside of a Walmart. If you're in the Albany area, you should drop in and check it out. It's located at 2825 Ledo Rd. in Albany and is open Monday-Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

As many of you already know, Camp Tanglewood and Camp Low were severely impacted by Hurricane Helene in September. Thanks to our dedicated rangers and volunteers, Camp Low is well on its way to being restored, but Camp Tanglewood still needs work. Troop 2012



1912 Society


